



Introducing Deacon Joe and Sherry Hartz

Over the past few weeks you may have noticed two new faces at Holy Mass. We are Joe and Sherry Hartz of Hixson, TN, having recently relocated here from St. Louis, MO. It is our desire to meet you, to develop friendships with you, to learn your stories and to share ours, and to serve.

I, Joe, was ordained into the Diaconate in 2016 for the Archdiocese of St. Louis, MO. I have recently been incardinated into the Diocese of Knoxville and assigned to the Basilica of Sts. Peter and Paul. I expect my deacon role here to be both similar and yet different from that in St. Louis. I will be serving alongside the priests at Mass, as well as other liturgical duties and privileges as the opportunity arises. In St. Louis, I served in Spiritual Care in a hospital setting (chaplaincy). Recently I have resumed that role at CHI Memorial Hospital in Chattanooga. Fr. Carter and I have talked about other possible service opportunities that will allow me to serve and get to know you. You will hear more about these at another time.



Sherry is a long-time lector, and looks forward again to serve in this role. She has many talents including leadership roles in parish life and organizations.
